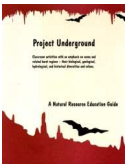


Join teachers, environmental educators, and naturalists, as we explore, explain and experience the value, variety, and vulnerability of our natural resources through a series of interactive workshops.

June 28 & 29, 2017 8:15 a.m. – 4:15 p.m.

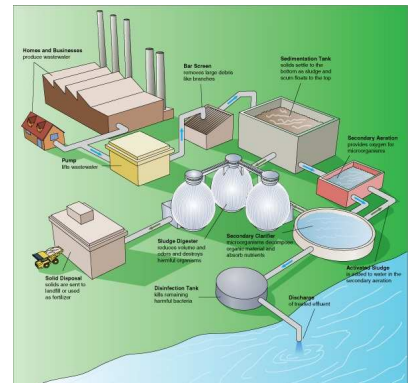
Rocks, minerals, and Ohio's geology and landforms will be explored through field trips and hands-on activities. Participants will be visiting the Olentangy Indian Caverns, Shale Hollow, and an Ice Age exhibit. The Project Underground Natural Resources Education Guide will be provided to everyone. At the conclusion of this two-day workshop, participants will leave with numerous hands-on classroom resources to assist with teaching about rocks, minerals, and landforms. \$50 workshop fee.



Going With the Flow: Water Trips and More

July 25 & 26, 2017 8:15 a.m. – 4:15 p.m.

This two-day workshop takes you on tours of drinking water and wastewater treatment facilities. Plans are being made (not finalized) to conduct biological water assessments during a 3-mile canoe trip; weather dependent. Hands-on lessons and resources will be provided to assist in teaching water topics. Key topics are water pollution, water use, water chemical testing, and fresh water assessments. \$50 workshop fee.

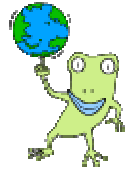
