

New Centers for Environmental Education

The Heart of the City

Downtown Columbus will soon be the home of the only urban ecology center in the state — and the first in the country located so close to a major city. Located in Whittier Peninsula, a designated Important Bird Area critical habitat, the Grange Insurance Audubon Center will transform a blighted and underused area of the city into an urban bird oasis and conservation center. With more than 100 schools and over 30,000 students located within a five-mile radius of the site, the center will empower urban youth to enjoy and protect nature right in their own backyard. Approximately 50,000 people are expected to flock to the center within the first three years of its opening in summer 2009.



The Grange Insurance Audubon Center initiative is led by private sector corporations such as Grange Insurance and Audubon Ohio, and public sector organizations, such as the City of Columbus and Franklin County Metro Parks. A Unique Treasure

Cedar Bog is home to many unique and endangered species. It is also home to a new education center. This past April marked the opening of the Cedar Bog Education Center.



For the first time, visitors can enjoy this beautiful nature preserve with the help of a newly built education center featuring an interpretive exhibit about Cedar Bog. The education center is designed with careful consideration to both visitor convenience and the preservation of the site's ecology. Bathrooms are always accessible during operating hours. The building employs "green" operations that both safeguard the environment and reduce operating costs. The center also contains the office of the site manager as well as a classroom, exhibit area and gift shop. Cedar Bog offers a variety of resources for educators. Supplement a class visit to Cedar Bog or explore information about the site without ever making a visit with our Cedar Bog Loan Kit. Located in Champaign County, just 4 miles south of Urbana on U.S. Rte 68, then west on Woodburn Rd one mile to the signed entrance and parking lot. The preserve is managed by the Ohio Historical Society in conjunction with the Cedar Bog Association. Hours may vary seasonally. Metro Parks Summer Courses for Educators
